# REPORT.

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No change in the law relating to the Post Office and Telegraph Department was made during the year 1877; the rates and fees chargeable in both divisions of the service remained, therefore, the same as upon publication of the last Annual Report. The several sources of revenue continue, however, to show a steady advance, and the increase in the general business of the department will be found to be proportionate to that of preceding years.

Towards the end of the year a renewed endeavor was made to conclude a postal convention with the United States for the transmission of direct mails between Melbourne and San Francisco, under an arrangement similar to that entered into by the Government of New South Wales. As Mr. George Collins Levey, Secretary to the Commissioners for the Paris Exhibition, was about to visit America, that gentleman was requested, on behalf of the Victorian Government, to bring the matter specially under the notice of the Postmaster-General, Washington. The result of the negotiation was satisfactory, a postal convention being agreed upon, subject to ratification by the Victorian Government, for a direct exchange of correspondence between Victoria and the United States, and for the transmission of closed mails from Victoria through the United States to other countries.

A copy of the convention will be found in the Appendix to this Report. (See pages 37 and 38.)

Arrangements are in progress for the establishment of the Post Office Money Order system between Victoria and the United States and Canada, on the same basis as the system which is at present in force between those countries and the United Kingdom; and the business will be commenced as soon as the necessary preliminaries have been completed.

Further correspondence has taken place respecting the proposal that Victoria (and the other Australian colonies) should join the International Postal Union, under the conditions of the arrangement concluded at Berne on the 27th January 1876. As, however, it was estimated that a loss of revenue to the extent of £1,500 per annum would be occasioned to this colony under the proposed arrangement, and as the Ocean Mail Services connecting with Australia will probably undergo important modifications within the next few years, it was deemed, after due consideration, inadvisable, at least until termination of the present mail contract, to join the International Union.

Early in the year a proposal was received from the Director-General of the Post Office of India, for the extension to Victoria of the Parcel Post system already existing between Europe and that country; and a proposition upon the same subject was subsequently submitted by the Peninsular and Oriental Steam Navigation Company, through whose agency parcels are proposed to be conveyed to the port of destination, and thence delivered through the Post Office. An alteration in the Customs Law is necessary before the system could be introduced into this colony, the subject has therefore been deferred with a view to the sanction of the Legislature being obtained, when the conditions under which the Post Office Department will be prepared to conduct the business in question will be notified.

With a view to the establishment of a through Ocean Mail Service *via* the Cape, which should alternate with that *via* Suez, and thereby secure to this colony practically a fortnightly mail, the Agent-General in London was instructed to advertise for tenders for a four-weekly Mail Service to Melbourne direct, by vessels of about 4,000 tons, and full horse-power; the voyage to be made in forty days or less, an additional subsidy being paid for thirty-eight, thirty-seven, thirty-six, and thirty-five

## ELECTRIC TELEGRAPHS.

*Additional Wires and Extensions.*

In the early part of the year the completion of the line of iron poles from Essendon to Wodonga was effected, and so far the results have been highly satisfactory.

The wires have been extended from Heidelberg to Eltham, and from Wedderburn to East Charlton, and communication also extended to Branholme, Bridgewater, Glenorchy, Heywood, Portsea, and Toorak.

Along the railway lines, wires have been erected from Geelong to Winchelsea, Ararat to Hamilton and Portland, Oakleigh to Bunyip, Moe to Sale, Sandhurst to Eaglehawk, and between Maryborough and Clunes; and the following are in progress, viz. :—between Bunyip and Moe, Birregurra and Colac, Clunes and Creswick, Maryborough and Avoca.

Under an arrangement with a private firm, a clock-controlling wire has been erected in the City, and availed of by nearly all the banks.

Repairs more or less extensive have been effected or are in progress on all the principal lines originally erected, the Cape Otway and Portland and Mount Gambier sections having been re-poled. Temporary repairs are in progress on the Melbourne and Ballarat, and the Melbourne and Sandhurst lines, but as soon as funds are available it is proposed having both these important lines placed in thorough repair.

- (3.) That in the meantime the South Australian Government be requested, on behalf of the several colonies, to urge upon the Eastern Extension Telegraph Company the necessity of keeping a repairing steamer between Banjoewangie and Port Darwin, to repair any accident to that portion of cable.
5. That having in view the serious annoyance and loss occasioned by the mutilation of messages in transmission through Java, the President of this Conference be requested, on behalf of the Australasian colonies represented, to communicate with the Secretary of State, for the purpose of obtaining permission from the Government of Netherlands-India to employ English operators on the land lines in Java.
6. That the Governments of South Australia and New South Wales be empowered to make arrangements with the Eastern Extension Telegraph Company for a reduction of message tariff to six shillings per word, at a subsidy not exceeding £20,000 per annum, terminable at one year's notice; and that such subsidy be borne by the respective colonies in proportion to population—any colony to be at liberty to withdraw on like notice.
- The colonies of New Zealand, Tasmania, and Western Australia refrained from voting on this resolution.
7. That the several colonies agree to allow the necessary official telegrams of H.M. ships to pass over their respective lines free of charge.
8. That the Governments of Queensland and South Australia be requested to circulate among the respective Governments the draft Bills referred to in the resolutions of the Intercolonial Conference held in Sydney, passed on the 10th February 1873, for removing the defects in the law relating to the extradition of criminals, and the absconding of debtors, with a view to the same being submitted to the respective Legislatures as early as practicable.

(The following are the resolutions referred to:—

“That the present state of the law in regard to the extradition of criminals escaping from one colony into another is defective. That the Government of Queensland be requested to prepare a Bill on the subject, which the representatives of the several colonies undertake—provided it is approved by their respective law officers—to endeavour to pass into law.”

“That the present state of the law in regard to remedies to be had against absconding debtors is defective.”

“That the Government of South Australia be requested to prepare a Bill to remedy the defects, and, subject to the approval of their respective law officers, the members of this Conference will endeavour to procure the passing of a similar Bill in their respective Legislatures.”)

9. That in the opinion of the Conference it is desirable that a uniform-telegraphic code should be adopted by the several Australasian colonies.

In regard to resolution No. 4, article 1, a letter has been received from the Chief Secretary of South Australia, intimating that negotiations had been opened with the Eastern Extension Telegraph Company, which had resulted in a proposal being submitted to lay a second cable from Singapore direct to Banjoewangie, avoiding the Java lines, and thence direct to Port Darwin, in consideration of an annual subsidy of £32,400.

With reference to article 2, a communication has been received from the Colonial Secretary, Wellington, forwarding copies of despatches received from the Secretary of State for the Colonies, announcing that Mr. Seward, Acting Secretary of State, Washington, had promised to bring the matter in connection with a telegraph cable between New Zealand and America under consideration of Congress; but it was stated that there could not be much hope that Congress would vote any considerable sum of money towards the completion of such an undertaking.

In accordance with resolution No. 7, arrangements have been made for all official telegrams of Her Majesty's ships to be allowed to pass over the Victorian telegraph lines free of charge.

To mitigate as far as possible the inconvenience that would arise from the suspension of telegraphic communication with Europe through the breaking of either of the submarine cables between Australia and Singapore, a contract was entered into in September last between the Postmaster-General, South Australia, and the Netherlands-India Steam Navigation Company for the conveyance of telegraphic despatches and mails to and from Banjoewangie and Port Darwin, in the event of communication by cable between those places being interrupted, upon the following terms and conditions, viz.:—The company to provide a suitable steamship of not less than 400 tons capacity, and to be paid at the rate of £1,250 for each complete trip from Banjoewangie to Port Darwin and return to Banjoewangie. The parties to the contract to be at liberty to terminate the same at any time by giving six months' notice in writing of intention to do so.

A contract, upon similar terms and conditions, was also entered into by the same contracting parties for the conveyance of telegraphic despatches and mails between Batavia and Singapore, in the event of the telegraph cable between those places being interrupted. For this latter service the company is to receive the sum of £1,050 for each complete trip from Batavia to Singapore and return to Batavia. The cost of both services will be borne by all the Australasian Colonies, each colony contributing in proportion to its population.

The number of Money Orders issued during the year was 131,173, against 123,025 in 1876; the difference showing an increase of 8,148, or 6.62 per cent.

The number of Money Orders paid during the year was 133,587, against 125,595 in 1876; the difference showing an increase of 7,992, or 6.36 per cent.

The value of the Money Orders issued during the year was £395,829 6s., against £379,570 10s. in 1876; the difference showing an increase of £16,258 16s., or 4.28 per cent.

The value of the Money Orders paid during the year was £423,588 8s. 3d., against £403,525 11s. 6d. in 1876; the difference showing an increase of £20,062 16s. 9d., or 4.97 per cent.

The number of new Savings Bank accounts opened during the year was 12,057; the number closed, 9,217; and the number remaining open on the 31st December, 44,361.

The total amount of Deposits received during the year was £430,230 2s. 1d., and the amount repaid, £418,322 17s. 9d.

The total amount of Interest placed to the credit of Depositors for the year was £22,904 15s.

The rate of Interest allowed to Depositors was 4 per cent.
